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Objectives

- > To make human activities in coastal and marine areas more sustainable
- To manage conflicts among concurrent uses and support the decisionmaking process
- To strengthen the role of ICZM in the whole Adriatic region and to prepare the ground for National and local strategies
- > To promote MSP in the Adriatic Region according to the EU key principles
- To reach an high level of coherence between planning in coastal areas and planning in maritime spaces, binding ICZM and MSP
- To improve the institutional building, the stakeholders involvement and the public awareness
- To share data and experience as a common base of knowledge allowing the coherent and conscious governance of the coastal and marine environment
- To develop a coherent picture of the Adriatic sea and contribute to EMODNET and to the objectives of the Marine Framework Strategy
- To coordinate the activities in the Adriatic Sea with other experiences in Europe
- To create an Adriatic Network promoting synergies among projects





Why an Adriatic project on ICZM and MSP?

- Extraordinary value: the Adriatic Sea is one o the most valuable inland seas of the world. Casts and sea are strategic for the well-being and prosperity of the Adriatic Countries: a big value, both economic and ecological
- Increasing pressures: human activities tend to develop together in coastal and marine areas, coming into conflict with each other and with protection needs of habitats and landscapes
- Added value of the cross-border cooperation: many issues transcend national borders; sharing a common approach to the management of marine space in the same sea basin will make easier to meet global challenges (eg. climate change)

Adriatic Euroregion

- Founded in June 2006
- Model of cooperation among regions of the Adriatic coast line
- 23 members: regional and local governments from Italy, Slovenia, Croatia, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Montenegro, Albania and Greece
- Emilia-Romagna Region as President of the Commission for Environment

What's new in the framework? About ICZM

- PROTOCOL ON INTEGRATED COASTAL ZONE MANAGEMENT IN THE MEDITERRANEAN
- At the Conference of the Plenipotentiaries on the ICZM Protocol that took place on 20-21 January 2008 in Madrid, the ICZM Protocol was signed. Six countries ratified the Protocol so far. With this 6th ratification (by Sirya on 30 September 2010), the ICZM Protocol has entered into force
- EU ratified the Protocol on September the 13rd 2010: as a matter of fact the Protocol is binding for all the EU Countries even if they haven't ratified the Protocol jet

What's new in the framework? About Integrated Maritime Policy

- On December the 17th 2010 the European Commission adopted the Communication 'Maritime Spatial Planning in the EU - Achievements and future development'. This Communication takes stock of the debate the Commission launched with the Roadmap Communication of 2008
- The 2010 Communication reports the results of the stakeholders workshops organized as part of the Roadmap consultation process, and reviews concrete and conceptual developments at both national and EU level: <u>http://ec.europa.eu/maritimeaffairs/pdf/com 2010 771 en.pdf</u>
- In order to determine the best way forward, the Commission has therefore launched an impact assessment to explore a range of options to promote and develop MSP and ICZM.




The Italian Government acknowledged the Directive with Act n. 190/2010
